- 4. What serves as the inspiration for Claes Oldenburg's sculptures?
- 5. When did the artist's fascination with functional, everyday objects begin?
- **6.** Oldenburg stated that he liked "to take an object and completely deprive it of its function." What did the artist mean by this?
- 7. How has Oldenburg deprived the cheeseburgers of their original function?
- **8.** What are the two objects depicted in Oldenburg's *Proposed Colossal Monument for the Thames River*, and why do you think the artist chose them?
- **9.** How does Oldenburg create "parallel realities" that force viewers to see objects in an entirely different way?
- **10.** What materials has Oldenburg used in *Soft Toilet*, and what effect does this have when combined with the work's large scale?
- 11. In creating Soft Fur Good Humors, how has Oldenburg changed the original object?
- 12. How does the toothpaste-tube sculpture differ from its everyday counterpart in scale? in materials and texture?
